

# Canadian Dental Care Plan



The Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP) covers a wide range of services such as scaling and polishing, exams, x-rays, fillings, dentures and root canals.

## Since the service rollout has started:

Two million Canadians have registered to receive dental care, including several hundred thousand in Quebec

Nearly 11,000 dental professionals have registered

Over 200,000 claims have been submitted

That is why we put this plan in place with the belief that all citizens deserve quality dental care. Since January 2024, hundreds of thousands of seniors have registered and from now on, all children under the age of 18 will have access.

## Who can benefit from this program?

- ✔ Seniors aged 65 and over;
- ✔ Children under the age of 18;
- ✔ Persons holding a valid certificate for the tax credit for disabled persons;
- 🕒 **Coming soon** All Canadians aged between 18 and 64.

## What are the eligibility requirements?

- ✔ Not having access to other dental insurance;
- ✔ Being a Canadian resident;
- ✔ Having an adjusted net family income of less than \$90,000;
- ✔ Being up to date with your income tax returns.

Once registered, you will receive a Sun Life card and you will be able to make an appointment with your dentist. 

## What treatments are covered:

Cleaning	Prosthetics
Exams	Surgery
X-rays	Endodontics
Repairs	Prevention



## What percentage of the cost will be covered by the CDCP?

Adjusted family net income below \$70,000	100% of eligible costs
Adjusted net family income between \$70,000 and \$79,999	70% of eligible costs
Adjusted net family income between \$80,000 and \$89,999	40% of eligible costs



You may have to pay additional fees directly to oral health care providers if you have a copayment, if your provider charges more than the CDCP fee guide, or if you accept treatment that is not covered by the plan. **Before receiving oral care, always ask your provider if there will be any costs that are not covered by the plan.**
